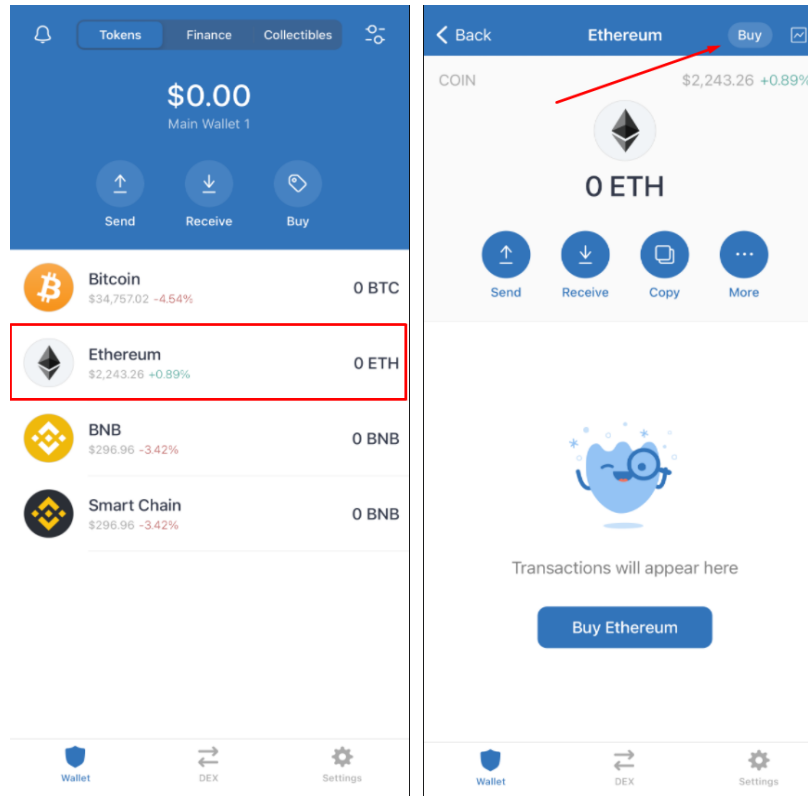


BUYING QAO

(Smartphone and PC required)

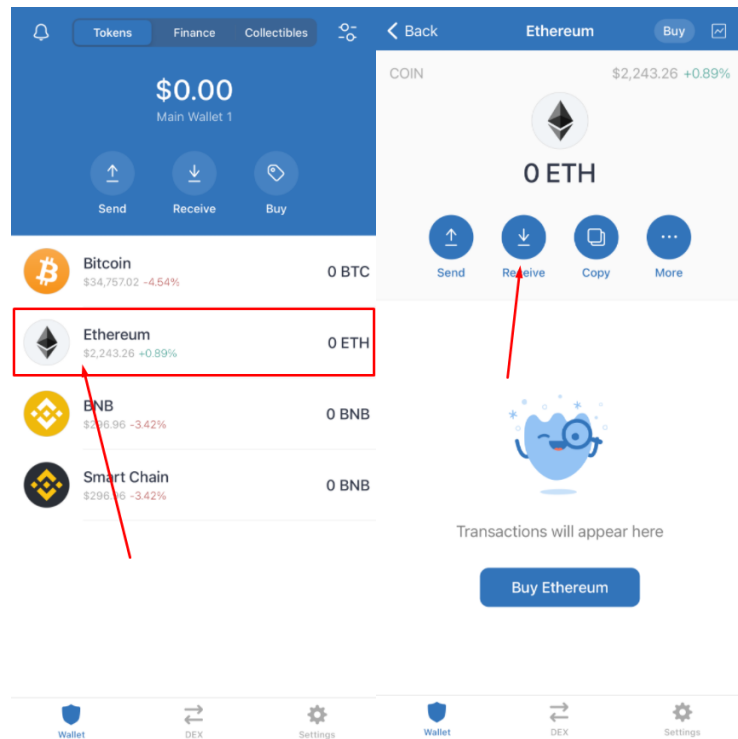
BUYING ETHEREUM IN TW

- ▶ Get TrustWallet app installed and setted up in your Smartphone
- ▶ As QAO is based in ethereum we will need to get some before swapping it to QAO.
- ▶ You can either directly buy it in TrustWallet or transfer it from a diferent source to your TrustWallet ETH address

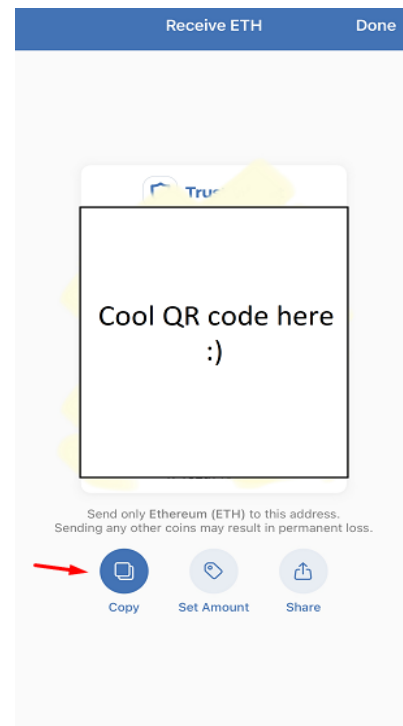


TRANSFERRING ETHEREUM TO TW

- ▶ Navigate to your ethereum wallet and select “Receive”



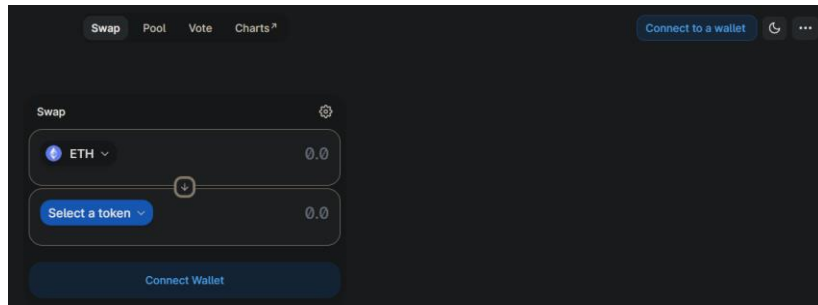
- ▶ This will show you your ETH wallet address both in QR code format and in text format (using “Copy”).



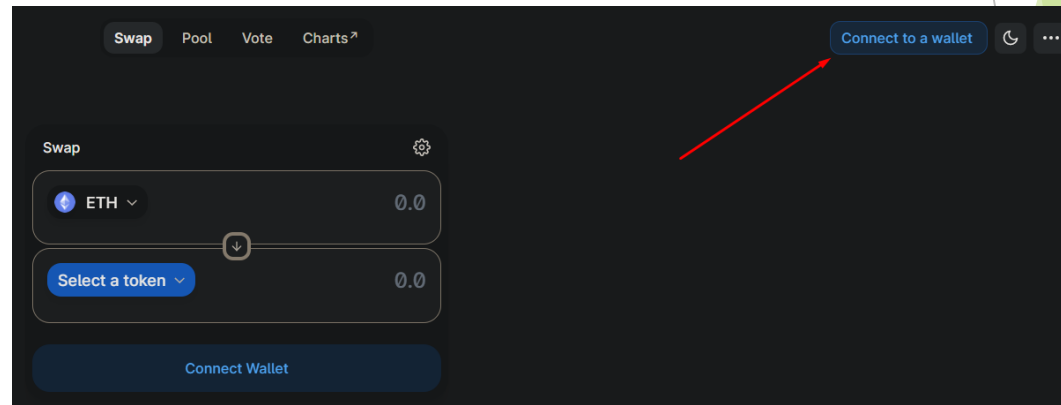
USING UNISWAP

- ▶ Now that we have ETH in our wallet we can go ahead and use uniswap to swap from ETH to QAO
- ▶ Use your computer browser and go to:

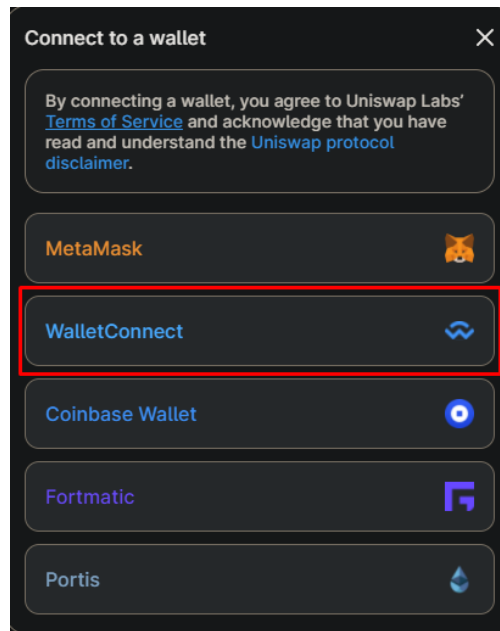


- ▶ After getting into UniSwap we have to connect our TrustWallet ETH address to it



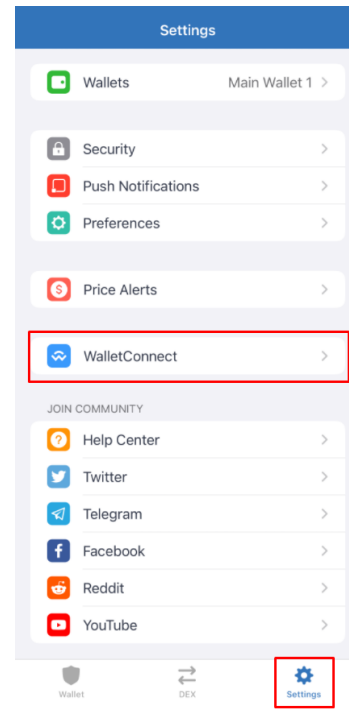
CONNECTING UNISWAP AND TW

- ▶ After clicking “Connect to a wallet” choose Wallet connect



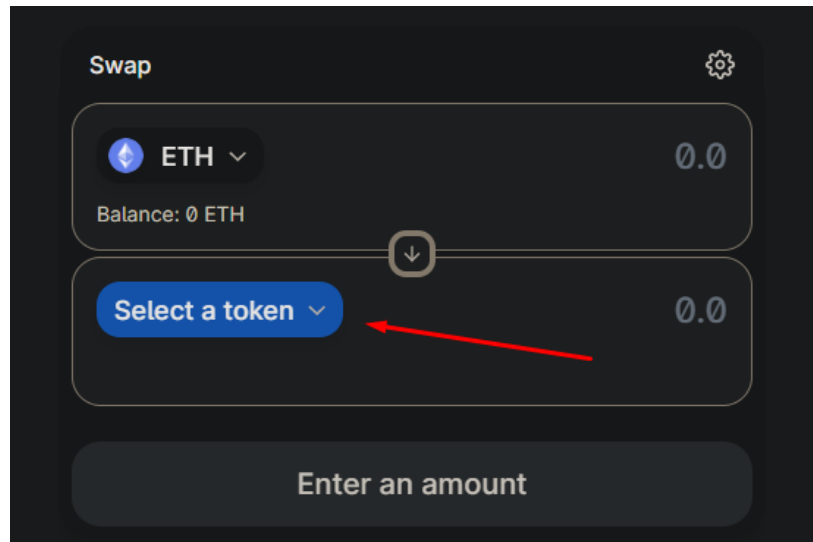
- ▶ A QR code will show up

- ▶ Now go back to your TrustWallet app, navigate to “settings” and select WalletConnect. A QR scanner will appear. Scan the UniSwap QR.



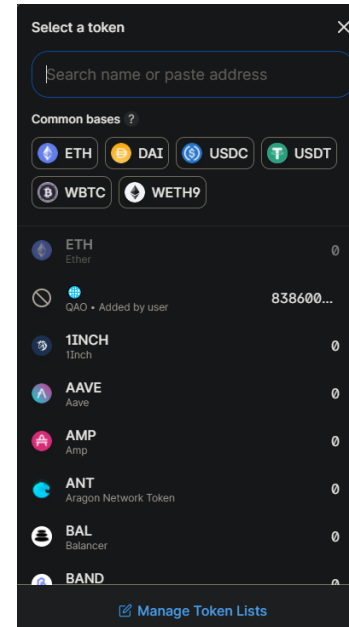
SWAPPING ETH FOR QAO I

- ▶ Now that UniSwap and TrustWallet are connected we can proceed:



Click on “Select a token”

- ▶ In the following textbox we will need to paste the QAO contract address




SWAPPING ETH FOR QAO II


- ▶ Contract: 0x3402E15b3EA0f1aEC2679c4Be4c6d051ceF93953

- ▶ Once QAO contract has been imported you can choose the amount of ETH to swap it for:

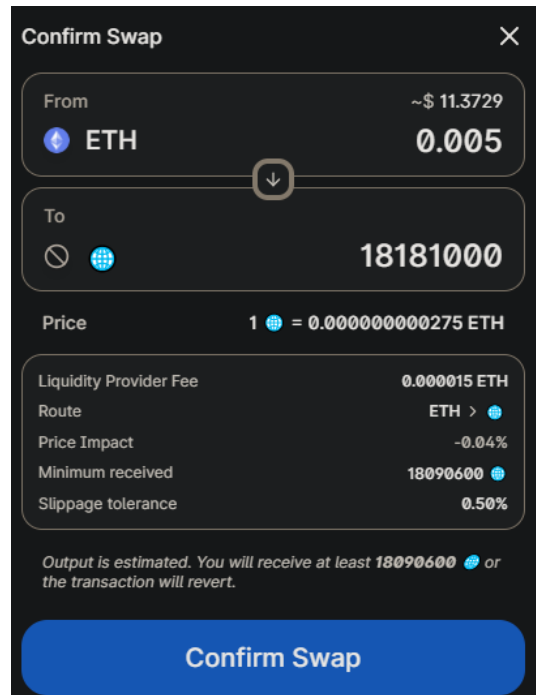

FEES AND CONFIRMATION

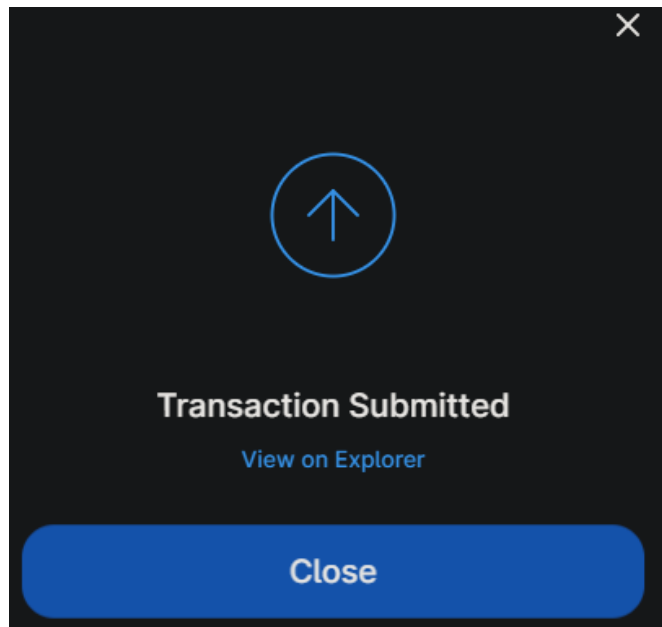
- ▶ Once you click on “Swap” it will show some details about the transaction:



- ▶ Then a confirmation will show up in your TrustWallet WalletConnect option. In there you will be able to verify one last time the details.
- ▶ The fees that you will see are out of QAO control. It's related to ethereum. The more transactions ETH is having the higher the fees are going to be. If you feel like the fees are too high you might want to try again later.

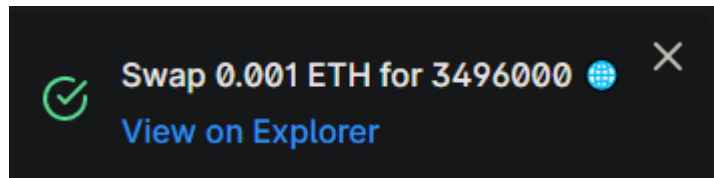
ALMOST DONE I

- ▶ Once you have approved it in your TrustWallet app this shouldn't take longer than a few minutes to complete



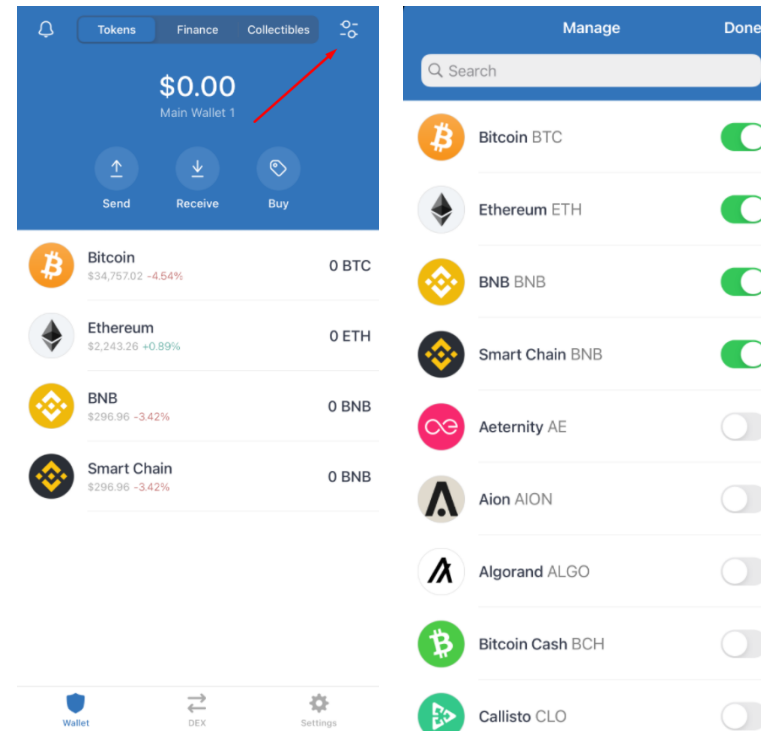
ALMOST DONE

- ▶ You should now be able to see it in your TrustWallet main view

- ▶ If it doesn't show up, you can search for it and add a custom token (using QAO contract address)
